International Colloquy organized on November 1st in Bucharest

part of the project Strengthening the role of the Romanian courts in the application of the state aid legislation

Transparency International Romania and The Romanian Magistrates Association invite you to participate at the International Colloquy organized on November 1st, between 10:00 – 17:00, in Bucharest.

Over 60 judges are expected at the event:

- 16 judges from EU member states such as Italy, Bulgaria, Estonia, Poland, etc.
- 50 national judges from the administrative contentious sections and the court's civil sections, courts of appeal, the High Court of Cassation and Justice of Romania.

Debate topics

- \Rightarrow the new regulations adopted regarding the State aid ;
- ⇒ the role of national courts in implementing State aid law (based on the notice on the enforcement of State aid law by national courts and on the notice regarding the illegal and incompatible aid recovery);
- ⇒ the request for provisional measures brought before the courts and its interaction with the EU Court proceedings.



The event format includes two plenary sessions and four panels moderated by specialists with significant experience in the field.

The event will also be a good opportunity in order to improve the cooperation among Romanian judges and judges from other EU countries and to create a cooperation network among participants. It will also be a suitable framework for the exchange of best practices regarding the application of European competition law, focusing on state aid.
